

Mr. Stanley Marling—

3rd son of the late Sir William
Marling.

Appointed County High Sheriff
in 1936.

Was for several years President
of Stroud General Hospital, an
in which he succeeded his sister-
in-law.

A former commander of "L" Coy,
5th Gloucester Regt. and was at
one time associated with the
woollen cloth industry, being a
partner in the firm of Marling and Co.
Stanley Mills, prior to its amalgamation
under the present style of Marling &
Evans.

a J.P., he sat regularly at
Whitminster and Stonehouse.

He was a member of County
Education Committee, chairman of lo-
opted Governors of Stroud Educational
Foundation and was for many
years chairman of King's Stanley
Parish Council.

Represented the parish on
Stroud R.D.C.

Member of Stroud Guardians'
Committee, Stroud Assessment Committee
and extended his activities to the
Council for the Preservation of Rural
England and held office of treasurer of
local branch.

Member of Diocesan Board of
Finance and has represented the
diocese at the National Church
Assembly.

Chairman of Amberley C.E.M.S.

He was the third brother to
hold the office of County High
Sheriff.

His eldest brother, Sir Percival
Marling and his younger brother,
Major W.S.P. Marling, having been
High ~~Sheriff~~ Sheriffs before him.
