Frederic William (Eric) Daniels, son of the late Mr. F.L. Daniels of Stringers Court, Rodborough.

He was the youngest boy to be admitted to Wycliffe College, going there when he was eight. With his brother Lionel he started a Wolf Cub Pack at the College and remained interested in scouting for the rest of his life, for many years being Group Scoutmaster at Rodborough. He left Wycliffe College in 1920, He finished school a week earlier than he should have done to become an appretice to the engineering firm of Mawdesleys at Dursley and later had his apprenticeship transferred to Listers. He then went to the family engineering concern of T.H. and J. Daniels Ltd and in 1929 he went to the Subsidiary controlled firm of Daniels (Cam) Ltd, manufacturers of fibre board and . He became a director at Cam in 1944 Previously he was for 25 years managing director. and in 1965 he was appointed chairman. / In 1937 he was made a director of T.H. and J. Daniels Ltd and following the death of his brother, Mr. J.L. Daniels, who was killed in a motoring accident in Derbyshire, he succeeded him as chairman in 1958. He continued as chairman until 1964 when he resigned (Mr. D.S.Robinson succeeding him) and he resigned from the Board in Dec. 1967 so that he could devot more time to his other interests and particularly of Daniels (Cam) Ltd whose business was expending.
