## Withdrawal of Railway Passenger Services

The Western Region of British Railways hereby give notice, in accordance with Section 56(7) of the Transport Act, 1962, that on and from Monday, 6th April, 1964 they propose to discontinue all Railway Passenger Services from the following stations on the Swindon—Gloucester Central Section of line.

<b>Brimscombe</b>	<b>Ebley Crossing Halt</b>

Any user of the Stations from which it is proposed to withdraw the Passenger facilities and any body representing such users desirous of objecting to the proposal, may lodge objections within six weeks of Saturday, 28th December, 1963, i.e. not later than Saturday, 8th February, 1964, addressing any objections to the Secretary of the South Western Area Transport Users' Consultative Committee, Magnet House, 32 Victoria Street, Bristol, 1.

### NOTE

If any objections are lodged within the period specified, the closure cannot be proceeded with until the Transport Users' Consultative Committee has reported to the Minister of Transport and the Minister has given his consent (Section 56(8) of the Transport Act, 1962.)
