## Laurie pens poetic plea for trees

BEST-selling author Laurie Lee has launched into verse in a bid to save Stroud's threatened Stratford Park trees.

Laurie, aged 75, is horrified at Stroud district council's plans to axe 12 beech trees for a road realignment scheme near a new Tesco store.

So the author of the best-selling Cider With Rosie, who lives in picturesque Slad, near Stroud, has dashed off a poem in protest. It reads:

"I think that I shall never see,

"A Tesco lovely as a tree, "And if we're forced to cut ours down,

"T'will shame the gateway to our town."

Laurie, who works at his London flat during the week, could not be contacted yesterday.

But last night his wife Kathy said at their Slad home her husband felt strongly that the trees should not be chopped down.

"He loves landscapes," she said. "And there is no need to remove these trees.

"It is a very beautiful corner.

Why suddenly have a bare patch made?"
