But with people opting to take payment in lieu of working their notice, it was anticipated everyone targeted would have left by the weekend.

Mr Gabbett said "While we regret having to do this, one reason was we have to get more competitive to stay in business.

"We are in the throes of quite a significant investment programme,

providing new machinery in the factory and offices.

"We also have a far better order book now than this time last year."

Mr Gabbett had warned beforehand that Redler's historic site was too large and that the business needed to relocate to survive.

The company is trying to sell out to supermarket developers Safeway.

Amalgamated Engineering and Electrical Union district secretary, Bill Evans, was unavailable for comment.
